Bamboo Strips

jiǎndú (简牍)

Before the Chinese invented paper in 205A.D., they used <code>jiăndú</code> (简牍) or long bamboo strips to record their writings. The bamboo strips were as long as a chopstick and twice as wide. The wood strips would be bound together to create a book or manual. The earliest surviving bamboo volumes dated to the 5th century B.C. However, references in these an later bamboo strips indicate that they were used possibly as early as the Shang dynasty (商代) – ending around 1100 B.C.
